This year, the American Society for Photobiology (ASP) will sponsor a 3-Minute Thesis competition at the Biennial Meeting in Tampa, Florida. Associate members who are current PhD students are invited to participate in the competition for a chance to win cash prizes! <u>The</u> <u>event will take place on the first day of the conference, May 12th, 2018</u> <u>at 3 PM.</u>

What is the 3-Minute Thesis (3MT) competition?

The 3-Minute Thesis competition gives a chance for participants to practice the ever-important "Elevator Speech" that is central to creating networking as well as translating your work to those layman outside your field. Participants will be given a single slide (without animations or videos) to present the significance of their scientific research to a panel of judges. Scoring is based on communication, comprehension, and engagement rather than scientific approach – and therefore accents the importance of presentation skills.

Why participate in a 3MT?

Skills development for research candidates

Participating in 3MT develops academic, presentation and research communication skills, while developing research candidates' ability to effectively explain their research in language appropriate to a non-specialist audience.

Building research culture in schools and institutes

3MT provides a valuable opportunity for research higher degree candidates to come together, get to know one another and talk about their research. It also provides a supportive environment in which schools and institutes can provide presentation skills training.

That sounds great and academic, but how much could I WIN !?

The ASP will present the following monetary awards to the winners of the 3MT: First place: \$500 Second place: \$250

Audience favorite: \$100 (voted on by attendees)

What are the rules for the competition?

- A single static PowerPoint slide is permitted (no slide transitions, animations or 'movement' of any description, the slide is to be presented from the beginning of the oration).
- No additional electronic media (e.g. sound and video files) are permitted.
- No additional props (e.g. costumes, musical instruments, laboratory equipment) are permitted.
- Presentations are limited to 3 minutes maximum and competitors exceeding 3 minutes are disqualified.
- Presentations are to be spoken word (e.g. no poems, raps or songs).
- Presentations are to commence from the stage.
- Presentations are considered to have commenced when a presenter starts their presentation through movement or speech.
- The decision of the adjudicating panel is final.
